

Introduction

New Hampshire Hold'em is a poker-based table game. The game is simple to play. Wins are based only on the player's final five card hand. The skill is in deciding how much to bet, or fold, as the cards are revealed.

Rules


1. Player makes ante wager.
2. Dealer gives each player two cards face down, and three community cards face down. Player may examine his own cards.
3. Player may fold or make a "3rd Street" bet, of one, two or three bets equal to the ante.
4. First community card is turned over.
5. Player may fold or make a "4th Street" bet, of one, two or three bets equal to the ante.
6. Second community card is turned over.
7. Player may fold or make a "5th Street" bet, of one, two or three bets equal to the ante.
8. Third community card is turned over.
9. All wagers paid according to the following pay table.

New Hampshire Hold'em Pay Table

Royal Flush	125 to 1
Straight Flush	80 to 1
Four of a Kind	30 to 1
Full House	8 to 1
Flush	6 to 1
Straight	4 to 1
Three of a Kind	3 to 1
Two Pairs	2 to 1
Pair of J's or Better	1 to 1
Pair of 7's thru 10's	Push
All other	Loss

Layout

OVERVIEW

NH Hold'em is a five-card poker game. Players compete against a payable, not against the dealer or other players.

Players ante and receive two cards. They either fold or buy the first community card (betting equal to their ante with an optional raise and re-raise equal to their ante). When that card is revealed, they either fold or buy the second community card (betting equal to their ante with an optional raise and re-raise equal to their ante). After that card is revealed, they either fold or buy the third and final community card (betting equal to their ante with an optional raise and re-raise equal to their ante).

Players need a pair of Jack's or better to win, and a pair of 7's to 10's to push. Odds printed on layout. All bets receive odds.

RECOMMENDED DEALING PROCEDURES

1. Dealer's will shuffle a 52 card deck.
2. To begin the game, players must make an Ante bet.
3. Working from left to right, the dealer gives each player two starting cards, face-down.
4. The dealer places three community cards—face down—in the assigned area.
5. After looking at their two cards, players have a choice:
 - a. Fold (and surrender their ante); or
 - b. Make a 3rd street bet with optional raise and re-raise equal to their ante.
6. The dealer then reveals the first community card.
7. Players have a choice:
 - a. Fold (and surrender their ante and 3rd street bets); or
 - b. Make a 4th street bet with optional raise and re-raise equal to their ante.
8. The dealer then reveals the second community card.
9. Players have a choice:
 - a. Fold (and surrender their ante, 3rd street and 4th street bets); or
 - b. Make a 5th street bet with optional raise and re-raise equal to their ante.
10. The dealer then reveals the third community card.
11. Working from right to left, the dealer reveals each player's two-card starting hand and combines it with the three community cards.

12. The dealer pays according to the posted payable. All winning bets receive the same odds payouts.

Additional Three Card Bonus Bet for NH Hold'em

Player's can make an additional Three Card Poker Pair Plus Bonus Bet on the NH Hold'em game. This bet will be paid or taken by the Dealer at the duration of the hand when all of their cards are exposed. Player's may choose to fold their NH Hold'em hands, but their Three Card Poker Pair Plus Bonus bet will remain live in the game. They may wager \$2-\$4 on the Three Card Poker Pair Plus Bonus Bet, which is based upon the Dealer's Three Up Cards(Flop, Turn, River). The Three Card Poker Pair Plus Bonus Bet will be paid as follows:

Three Card Poker Pair Plus Bonus Bet:

Straight Flush 40 to 1

Three of a Kind 30 to 1

Straight 6 to 1

Flush 3 to 1

Pair 1 to 1
