The Lodge at Belmont

Belmont 10K Ladder Promotion

Objectives:

- Provide a process by which players may have an opportunity to play in a regular tournament and have a chance to win their way into a future tournament with larger than normal prizes.
- Do so at a manageable initial cost to the player.
- Encourage repeat business to support the venue and its' charities.

Synopsis:

- By participating in regularly scheduled or impromptu Texas Hold-'Em tournaments (Rung Ones) at the Lodge at Belmont during a set time period, players may win entry into the final event (Rung Two) scheduled at the end of that period.
- Players may play in as few or as many tournaments as they would like during the period.
- Tournaments will be run with no alterations to The Lodge at Belmont's tournament standards.
- The Rung Two tournament will also allow players who did not win entry via Rung One to buy in directly, at a cost of \$250.00..

Rung One:

- Rung One events will be scheduled twice per week during the Ladder period, at an entry cost of \$40 per player, with a minimum of eight (8) players needed to start.
- Impromptu Rung One events would be played whenever eight or more players express interest (per the Lodge's Sit and Go entry format on the gaming schedule)
- For each 8 players registered, one player will be awarded a prize consisting of a \$250 paid registration into the scheduled Rung Two event, purchased using funds directly from the prize pool of each tournament.
- All remaining prize pool funds that total less than \$250 will be paid to the next finishing position after the overall winners.

Example:

- 18 players register for a Rung One tournament.
- The buy-ins would total \$720, of which \$576 (80%) would be awarded as prizes.
- First and Second place would each receive a prize of a \$250 registration to the Rung Two event.
- Third place would receive \$76 in cash.

Rung Two:

- The Rung Two event will be scheduled for the end of the period, and all players wishing to enter a Rung One will know before doing so exactly when the Rung Two shall be played. This is to insure that no player is playing for a prize they may not be able collect.
- The Rung Two event will have an entry cost of \$250 per player, with a maximum of ninety players.

Prize Pool:=80% of total buy-ins

- The Rung Two event will pay first place a prize of \$5,000.00
- The remaining money in the prize pool will be paid using the Lodge's standard posted prize payout structure.

Championship:

- The Championship event will be No Limit Texas Hold-'Em, utilizing the Lodge's standard blind structure with all blind levels adjusted to 25 minutes. Players will begin the event with 10000 tournament units (chips).

Benefits:

- Players benefit by having an opportunity to play for larger than usual prizes.
- Charities hosting days when Rung One events are held benefit from larger tournament fields as well as increased residual traffic at other games of chance and in other tournaments held on that day.
- Charities hosting days when championship events are held benefit from increased by receiving 35% of the 10K monies left over after prizes are paid as well as residual traffic at other games of chance and a residual increase in participation in other tournaments held on that day.
- The state benefits by receiving 3% of the total buy ins for the tournament, a tournament which would not have been played or have the amount of buy ins but for the promotion being in place.
- The Game Operator benefits by sharing the money left over after prizes are paid from the 10K tournament as well as increased food and beverage sales and increased play in other tournaments that day as well as cash games.

Note: All games played for this or any tournament are games that have been approved by the Racing and Charitable Gaming Commission.
