

## Heads Up Tournament Structure Written Procedures

### Definition:

In a Heads Up tournament, players are pitted against one opponent at a time in a bracket style system. The winner of each one on one, or heads up, match moves on to the next level of the bracket, while the loser is eliminated from the tournament.

### Object of the Game:

Players will attempt to survive a series of heads up matches to advance in the tournament.

### Rules of the Game:

Upon entry, a player will be randomly given a position on a bracket, similar to the NCAA tournament's bracket, except without a ranking system.

If there is not an exact factor of 2 (2, 4, 8, 16, 32, 64 etc...) number of players in the field, byes will be handed out randomly to an appropriate number of players to make a functioning bracket system.

Tournament rules will remain consistent with all current tournament rules.

Players will be made aware of the prize pool distribution, and rules and regulations of the room by posted material on bulletin boards.

All players will begin the tournament with 5,000 tournament chips. These chips have no cash value.

A maximum field of 64 players will be allowed entry into the tournament.

### Equipment to be used:

Each dealer will be issued starting chips for two players, a deck case consisting of two different colored decks of cards, a cut card and a button. As there will be no rebuying options for the players, there will be no rebuy sheets or rebuy chips at the tables.

### Method of Play for the Games:

Like any bracket system, this tournament will be conducted in a series of rounds. For all rounds, blinds will last ten minutes. The blinds for each round will follow the house standard blind structure from the point which they start.

Round One: Players begin with 5,000 tournament chips, blinds start at 25/50

Round Two: Players begin with 10,000 tournament chips, blinds start at 50/100

Round Three: Players begin with 20,000 tournament chips, blinds start at 100/200

Round Four: Players begin with 40,000 tournament chips, blinds start at 200/400

Round Five: Players begin with 60,000 tournament chips, blinds start at 300/600

Round Six: players begin with 80,000 tournament chips, blinds start at 400/800

Tournament entry will be capped at 64 players, which limits the tournament to six rounds, maximum.

**Types of Wagers for the game/Wager amount for the game:**

There will be a flat \$100 buy in fee with no rebuys.

All games will be no Limit Texas Hold 'Em, following all established tournament wagering rules.

**Payout and Payout odds:**

The game operator or house will pay out one player for each round needed to complete the tournament, with a percentage of money being returned to players in accordance with our approved games schedule.

In the event of a chop, other positions will be determined by a playoff round.

**House Rules Applicable to All Games:**

This tournament will be held in compliance with all standard tournament house rules.
