

**II. SEABROOK BAD BEAT JACKPOT  
Tournament and Sit-N-Go**

**Procedure:**

The Seabrook Bad Beat Jackpot will be operated on all Texas Hold-em games where chips have no monetary value, including tournaments and sit-n-go games. One dollar (\$1) will be deducted for each player from the prize pool in each tournament and sit-n-go game conducted at Yankee Greyhound Park. This money will be deposited into the Seabrook Gaming Jackpot Account at TD Bank with a branch in Seabrook, NH.

On a daily basis, the amount of the Jackpot will be designated on the Daily Reconciliation Report generated by Seabrook Gaming and would include the carryover amount from any previous days, the amount generated from that day and a total amount available for payment in the event the Jackpot is hit the next day. The total amount in the Jackpot and the amount available to be paid will be updated and posted at Seabrook on a daily basis.

In the event of a verified winning hand, the amount to be paid will be 80% of the total Jackpot funds available at the start of the day. The remaining 20% will remain in the account as the beginning of the next Bad Beat Jackpot. Players must be 18 or over, and be participating (paid, registered and playing) at the winning table. A player who has gone to the restroom is considered to be participating, a player who has been knocked out is not considered to be participating. All winners will be paid by check, after verification of the qualifying winning hands. 100% of the prize money would eventually be paid to the customers in Jackpots. In the event the Tournament and Sit-N-Go Bad Beat Jackpot were to end, at least 30 days notice must be posted at Yankee Greyhound Park with the date of the distribution and the method of distribution, both of which must be approved by the Commission.

**Qualifying Winning Hands:** In the event a player loses full house (AAAKK) or higher to a higher hand during a Texas Hold-em tournament or Sit-N-Go game, that hand would qualify provided both hole cards are used in both hands (Both players must use both of their hole cards to qualify, for 4 of a kind, the player must have a pocket pair) and the hand is verified by the appropriate Dealer, Floor Managers and Room Manager.

**Verification:** In the event of potential winning Bad Beat Jackpot hands, the Dealer must stop all action on the table and instruct all players to not touch any of the cards. The Dealer must then call the Floor Manager to the table and tell the Floor Manager exactly what had occurred. The Floor Manager shall contact the Room Manager and then inquire with the other players at the table what had happened. The Floor Manager upon completion of verbally verifying the action that took place with the players and Dealer, shall then have the dealer collect all of the cards and suit them on the table and make sure all 52 cards are accounted for and no others. The Room Manager shall have the surveillance room check to see if there is clean video and if anything during that played hand appeared to be suspicious or out of the ordinary. In the event the verification shows no suspicious activity and the Floor Manager has no conflicting accounts of the action, the Jackpot shall be paid in the following manner.

Player with losing hand:	50% of the Jackpot available to be paid at the beginning of that day (available jackpot 80% of total)
Player with winning hand	30% of the Jackpot available to be paid
Other players at table	Remaining 20% of the Jackpot available to be paid, shall be distributed evenly between all of the remaining players at the table. Amount of payment shall be rounded down to the nearest \$1. Any breakage shall remain in the Jackpot Account for the next Bad Beat Jackpot. In the event of Heads up play (two players), the 20% of the Jackpot for other players shall remain in the jackpot account for the next jackpot.

Upon payment of the Jackpot, the names and player card numbers shall be obtained for all payees.

In the event the verification process reflects too many cards in the deck, incorrect cards in the deck or other activity determined in the sole judgment of Seabrook Gaming LLC, which does not reflect that the hands were obtained in a proper fashion, the Jackpot will not be paid and the game will resume with a new deck.

Upon the determination of the Room Manager that a payout should or should not be paid, play will resume and a report shall be written with names of all involved including the players, dealer, Floor Manager(s) and Room Manager describing the incident and including the result and payouts if any. The form to be used for this report is

attached.

Employees of Seabrook Gaming LLC shall not be eligible to win or participate in the payout of any Seabrook Bad Beat Jackpot conducted at Yankee Greyhound Park. If the employees participate in the tournament or Sit-N-Go, the \$1 will still be deducted from the prize pool and placed into the Jackpot Account. In the event an employee is at a table where the Bad Beat Jackpot hand is verified, the portion of the winnings the employee would have won would be returned to the Jackpot for the next Bad Beat Jackpot winners.

\*As of October 19, 2014 Seabrook Gaming will continue to run the Tournament/Sit n Go Bad Beat Jackpot as previously structured/approved.
