**Casablanca Casino LLC.
Lakes Region Casino Cash Bad Beat**

Objectives:

- Provide a means of rewarding a poker player who has a hand which would normally be expected to win, lose to a superior hand during texas hold-em cash games
- Increase participation in poker cash games

Synopsis:

- Players have the right to collect the prize pool in the event they meet the criteria for a "bad beat"

Participation:

- All players participating in the cash games in which the bad beat occurred will be eligible to win part of the bad beat.

Eligible Events:

- Texas Hold Em Cash Games of any limit. 1-1, 1-2, 2-2, 1-3, 2-4, 4-4, 1-4

Hand Criteria and Cost

- To be considered a "bad beat" the losing hand must be at least a full house of three Aces and two Kings.

- Both players involved (the winning hand and the losing hand) must use both hole cards, three (and only three) cards on the "board" (the five cards consisting of the flop, turn, and river) and must play to showdown. Four of a kind hands must consist of a pair in the hole, including both hands if it's four of a kind over four of a kind.

-There must be a minimum of 4 players at the table for the jackpot to be hit. No jackpot rake will be taken with fewer players.

-Only best and second best hands qualify

-If a player walks away from the game but leaves chips prior to a showdown on the table and he or she was dealt in the hand, they will retain their rights to their share of the jackpot if a jackpot hand occurs.

-A player with live chips at the table has a right to the prize money, even if they weren't dealt in.

-A \$1.00 maximum amount will be removed from each pot that totals \$20.00 or more including the rake. In order for a hand to be eligible for the bad beat payout, the pot must meet the \$20.00 requirement. The hand must go to a showdown (played to the end, where all cards have been dealt and players have completed betting and show their cards to determine a winner) in order for the jackpot to be awarded.

- The bad beat jackpot will be posted daily at the beginning of the day.

-If the bad beat is hit, 80% of the pot will be paid out, with the other 20% rolling over to continue the jackpot. The amount paid out will be the jackpot number posted at the beginning of the day. The bad beat payouts will break down, as follows:

- 40% to the losing hand
- 20% to the winning hand
- 20% split among everyone at the table
- 20% rolled back into the jackpot
